California Pacific Medical Center, which provides health care for more than 40% of San Francisco patients, plans to modernize our system of care while meeting state earthquake safety mandates. We plan to build two state-of-the-art acute care hospitals, one conveniently located at Van Ness and Geary and one at our St. Luke's Campus, and to complete a major renovation at our Davies Campus. Our citywide plan will double the number of earthquake-safe beds in San Francisco, improve privacy and infection control by creating all single-patient rooms, inject \$2.5 billion into the economy while creating 1,500 construction jobs, and improve health care access for all San Franciscans. This integrated system of care depends on each component working together to ensure that CPMC can continue to deliver the best care for this and future generations.

RENOVATING OUR DAVIES CAMPUS

Completing a major renovation of our Davies campus is one pillar of our plan to Rebuild CPMC. This campus has deep roots in the Castro District and a reputation for pioneering research and treatment of HIV/AIDS as well as for microsurgery, and for providing compassionate care for patients and their loved ones.

Our vision for the future of this campus is to transform it into the medical destination of choice for neurosciences services, reconstructive microsurgery and acute rehabilitation, while maintaining its character as a full-service community hospital, including emergency services. Our plan is the result of collaboration with the community, as well as health care advocates and our own physicians and staff.

OUR PLAN FOR COMPLETING THE DAVIES CAMPUS RENOVATION

- Expanded care and services for patients with neurological conditions such as stroke, brain tumors and ALS (Lou Gehrig's disease)
- Enhanced rehabilitation services to allow patients to receive same-site treatment and follow-up care
- An enclosed Muni pavilion for patients and the community, including connection to the hospital in order to facilitate easier access to the campus
- Improved landscaping and a widened sidewalk on Noe Street to maintain the character of the neighborhood

Parking: 290 spaces (existing garage)

DAVIES CAMPUS RENOVATIONS ALREADY COMPLETED INCLUDE:

- Structural upgrades to existing buildings that meet state seismic safety requirements
- Non-structural upgrades, including installation of wireless nurse call systems and improved fire/sprinkler systems
- Streetscape improvements, including tree replacement and sidewalk re-pavement
- Opening of the California Pacific Regional Rehabilitation Center, the Archibald/Ehrenberg Rehabilitation Terrain Park, a neuro-interventional room for complex neurological procedures, and a chapel
- Two new, modern operating rooms with improved diagnostic and communication systems as well as "smart" lighting to minimize heat and shadows in the surgical work area, and increased space for neuro and microsurgical equipment

A CITYWIDE SYSTEM OF CARE

The renovated Davies Campus will continue to be a full-service hospital, providing outpatient, inpatient, critical care and emergency services, from the trusted and dedicated staff that the campus is known for. The neurological, rehabilitation and microsurgical services at Davies will complement the services offered at both the new facilities at St. Luke's and at Van Ness and Geary, and will support a network of outpatient facilities and physician practices. CPMC will continue to operate its inpatient psychiatric program as well as 100 skilled nursing facility (SNF) beds for our patients who need additional care after a hospital stay. This citywide system of care promises to provide the care our patients need for generations to come.
