Proposed Hospital at Van Ness & Geary, View from Van Ness & Post



California Pacific Medical Center, which provides health care for more than 40% of San Francisco patients, plans to modernize our system of care while meeting state earthquake safety mandates. We plan to build two state-of-the-art acute care hospitals, one conveniently located at Van Ness and Geary and one at our St. Luke's Campus, and to complete a major renovation at our Davies Campus. Our citywide plan will double the number of earthquake-safe beds in San Francisco, improve privacy and infection control by creating all single-patient rooms, inject \$2.5 billion into the economy while creating 1,500 construction jobs, and improve health care access for all San Franciscans. This integrated system of care depends on each component working together to ensure that CPMC can continue to deliver the best care for this and future generations.

MEETING THE HEALTH CARE NEEDS OF OUR SICKEST PATIENTS

One pillar of our plan to Rebuild CPMC is to replace capacity for women's and children's services from our California Campus and adult acute care services from our Pacific Campus at a new full-service community hospital located at Van Ness and Geary. Locating our women's, children's and adult inpatient services in one building will improve the level of care and operational efficiency for all our patients. For the first time, CPMC patients from throughout the city who need services like invasive cardiology, organ transplant or newborn intensive care will find the specialty care teams and systems that support them all in one place.

OUR PLAN FOR A NEW CAMPUS AT VAN NESS AND GEARY

- 555 acute care beds to accommodate patients currently seen at our California and Pacific campuses as well as the increase in demand due to an aging population
- Inpatient medical care, surgical care, pediatrics, critical care, labor and delivery, and post-partum care, and specialized programs such as organ transplantation, interventional cardiology and newborn intensive care
- Single patient rooms that will improve privacy and infection control
- An emergency department with dedicated treatment areas for general care, pediatric care, critical care and triage, as well as a secured psychiatric area, staffed 24/7, located in the center of the city
- A new medical office building located across from the hospital on Van Ness, connected to the hospital by an underground tunnel
- A central location that is highly accessible by public transit and located on bedrock soil for earthquake safety
- A hospital that can safely remain open and continue to provide essential services after an earthquake or other disaster, including emergency generator power for up to 96 hours, designated areas for mass triage and isolated ventilation, and built-in showers and tanks for mass decontamination

A CITYWIDE SYSTEM OF CARE

The new facility at Van Ness and Geary will be a full-service hospital providing essential health care services that the community needs, including improved systems for emergency and disaster response. This campus will complement the services at our other medical campuses and support an extensive network of outpatient facilities and physician practices. CPMC will continue to operate its inpatient psychiatric program as well as 100 skilled nursing facility (SNF) beds for our patients who need additional care after a hospital stay. This citywide system of care promises to provide the care our patients need for generations to come.
